- It was agreed an attendance register should be produced for the next meeting
- Members would like to receive the 'Marmot Report' – outlining how disadvantage starts early in life and has lifelong implication
- The CCG website should have links to local information & services
- A document listing the architecture of the revised NHS – this will be made available
- Pam Lee (Public Health Consultant) took the group through the role of public health and their work in Sunderland
- The Director of Public Health (DPH) will be invited to present the Annual Report (13/14). The link for 11/12 will be forwarded by Nonnie Crawford. N.B. an Annual Report was not produced for 12/13
- The group would like to advise on the accessibility of the information

- Discussion took place regarding the need to join up services and queried whether the DPH and CCG had the 'clout' to do this. The role of the Health & Wellbeing Board was discussed in achieving this objective.
- The DPH is represented on the CCG Board and has already brought PH issues to their attention e.g. cancer, smoking, Cardio Vascular Disease (CVD), sexual health, childhood immunisation, unemployment ..
- NHS health checks were discussed and how accessibility could be improved. This will be a future agenda item
- Access to services in general was discussed, particularly the shortfall in North East Ambulance Service (NEAS) patient transport service. This will be a future agenda item.
- Nicol Truman (Community Officer) within the local authority (LA) took the group through the role of community development work and priorities for East Sunderland. Nicol is happy to come back with further information. Her main areas of work are supporting Area Committees and Voluntary and Community Sector Networks for the LA.
- There is an East Area Community Plan which Nicol will forward.
- Adult Social Care currently consists of about 700 services and they are currently being assessed for accessibility. The group may choose to explore this further.
